

Enhancing First Nations Representation On Juries

McGuinty Government Appoints Respected Jurist To Conduct Review

Former Supreme Court of Canada Justice, the Honourable Frank Iacobucci, will review the process for including individuals living in First Nations reserve communities on the province's jury rolls.

The province appointed Mr. Iacobucci to conduct a review of existing processes, hold consultations, evaluate best practices, and provide a final report within a year. As part of the review, recommendations will be made on how to enhance First Nations representation on the jury roll. Mr. Iacobucci will seek input from First Nations communities and other interested parties.

- Throughout his distinguished career, Mr. Iacobucci has served as Vice-President of Internal Affairs and Dean of the Faculty of Law at the University of Toronto, Deputy Minister of Justice and Deputy Attorney General of Canada, Chief Justice of the Federal Court of Canada, and Justice of the Supreme Court of Canada.
- Mr. Iacobucci has received numerous awards and honours including being appointed a Companion of the Order of Canada.
