


Do you have an

To aswerdlyk: There is no shortage of learned opinion here relating to an incident where no one was present. There is a broad attempt to exonerate the police based on a wide assortment of hypotheticals: this is just native spin, there was a misunderstanding, the letter writer is incompetent in his normal role as Grand Chief, which is the expected ad hominem attack.

But, as with any incident, there are contextual clues that have not been addressed. In the original report, the facilitator alleged that during the presentation, the police were laughing, but according to police's own defence of this, they were "laughing at a sidebar conversation" and not the presentation. The point is not what they were laughing about, but the fact that they were laughing during the presentation.

The facilitator also alleges that some officers "turned their chairs around during the presentation." This is the single most important allegation if true, simply because it is unmistakable in its intent. Did at least some police officers turn their chairs/backs on the presenter during the presentation? It is yes or no.

Third, the most contentious point is that under pressure to provide evidence of police insouciance and hence racism with respect to murdered women, it is alleged that the facilitator just packed up and left. But, according to the facilitator, there were also accusations where the facilitator was "accused of lying." Was the facilitator accused or not, because it is one thing to say "you are lying," and another to say "the statistics are wrong." In fact, there is a huge difference between the two.

I don't know what happened. The facilitator is not talking, and the police would likely prefer this incident to disappear. I would not indict the police based on what I know, but if asked the question as to whether the police may have conducted themselves inappropriately, I would say it is possible.
